Many of our students need more practice activities during that long week between tutoring sessions. USA Learns is a great FREE resource for practicing English! To access this free website, students only need an internet connection and an email address. Students can practice using a computer or on their cell phone.

- Does your beginning level student need more listening practice? Each of the courses includes dozens of videos that are geared toward beginning students.
- Does your student need more practice with vocabulary? The USA Learns courses are organized around the same types of topics in our Adult ESL textbooks: community, food, health, shopping, recreation.
- Does your student need pronunciation and spelling practice? Students can click on words to hear pronunciation and record their own voice for practice. Each of the vocabulary units includes spelling practice activities.
- There is also a Citizenship Module for your student who is preparing for their U.S. Citizenship Test.
- If your student doesn't have an email yet, that's a perfect short-term goal to work on! Talk to your coordinator if you have questions about this or other resources, or if you need help getting your student signed-up for USA Learns!
