Her other tutor, Larry Rosenbaum, is one of the busiest tutors we have at TEACH. He tutors several students in various locations in addition to Rouhi. Larry really enjoys the diverse backgrounds of his students, and he loves when they share their culture and traditions. Constantine's Corner

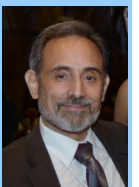
