Pronouns	Pronouns
I, we, you, they	He, she, it
Verbs	Verbs
live	lives
call	calls
cook	cooks
drive	drives
talk	talks
read	reads
have (tener)	has (pronounced "haz")
go	goes
do (hacer)	does (pronounced "duz")
don't	doesn't

When using present tense verbs, it is necessary to add "s" to the verb when using he, she or it.

- He drives a red car.
- She talks to her mother every day.
- It likes to sleep all day.

When using "does" with a present tense verb, the "s" is not used.

- Does he drive a red car?
- Does she talk to her mother every day?
- Does the cat sleep all day?
