

Common Prepositions

Prepositions of Time: at, on, in

We use *at* with specific times.

We use *on* with days and dates.

We use *in* for nonspecific times during a day, a month, a season, or a year.

Prepositions of Place: at, on, in

We use *at* for specific addresses

We use *on* with names of streets, avenues, etc.

We use *in* for the names of land-areas (towns, counties, states, countries and continents).
